Possible Leak Adjustment for 385 7th St.

The District received a request to consider an adjustment to the water bill and sewer service charge for 385 7th St. due to a leak. Usage records show regular water usage on a five year average. The five year average usage for the combined December and February bills was 23HCF. The past December and February billed usage was 50 HCF with an excessive usage of 27 HCF

11HCF + 12HCF = 23 HCF (December and February combined) 50 HCF (used) – 23 HCF (average) = 27 HCF Excessive usage

The District verified the leak has been fixed and the high usage ended on December 8, 2014.

The December and February water bills will be used to assess the sewer service charge for said property. If it is determined that the leak did enter the sewer system, per the District's refund policy one third of the excessive usage covers the cost of treatment (27 HCF / 3 = 9HCF). The customer should then be assessed 32 HCF total wet weather usage (23HCF+9HCF=32HCF). Based on last years' sewer service charge this would result in a refund of \$707.94 (50HFC-32HFC=18HFCx\$39.33=707.94). The customer also receives a refund on the water side of \$53.57.

If it is determined that the excessive usage did not enter the sewer system, the customer should be assessed 23HCF.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize a reduction of the wet weather usage for 385 7th St. to 32HCF. Based on last years' service charge this would result in a refund of \$707.94

I came out to 385 7th St. on 2/24/15 @ 1:30pm to take a profile of your meters usage history for the last 6 months.

The leak began on 11/24/14 around 8am. It was leaking at approx. 1.8 units per day.

The leak was fixed on 12/8/14 around 1pm. After that there were times with zero movement on the meter.

You last two bills were high due to the leak being at the end of one billing period and the beginning of the last.

Your march bill appears to be normal if nothing out of the ordinary occurs from here on forward.

I have included a graph and log of your meter so that you can see the usage by the hour. The graph begins just before the leak started and ends a few days after it was fixed.

It is read in cubic feet per hour. There are 7.48 gallons of water in one cubic foot.

If there are any more questions regarding this I will do my best to help resolve them


I am a local contractor my company name is G&G Construction. On 12/13/14 I was called to the home of Judy Graham at 385 7th Street in Montara due to a leak from her ice maker. The leaking water went into the stand-up crawl space directly below her kitchen, I found that the area was muddy and covered approximately a 5' x 5' area.

When I arrived, the ice maker valve under the house had already been shut off a few days earlier, and I confirmed that it had been shut off completely. I would estimate the leak had been happening for a couple of weeks.

SUBJECT: Receive Actuarial Valuation for PARS Pension

Plan.

Staff was directed to examine procuring a pension program through the Public Agency Retirement System (PARS). The benefit parameters include a Defined Benefit Plan for all full-time employees based on 2% @ 62 full formula and at least 5 years of District service, and final compensation based on the highest average consecutive 36 months of compensation with the District. Parameters include an employee contribution equal to at least half of the on-going normal cost of the benefit.

The District asked Bartel Associates to prepare the actuarial evaluation. Mary Beth Redding will present the actuarial evaluation tonight to the full Board. Staff will ask the full Board to consider adopting the PARS plan at the June 4 meeting.

Outdoor Irrigation to Twice per Week.

The State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) is released final regulations to implement the Governors executive orders, one of them requiring a 25% reduction of potable water use in California. The draft regulations call for small water systems to either implement a 25% reduction in water use compared to 2013 or implement a restriction to outdoor irrigation to twice per week.

Legal Counsel prepared an ordinance that limits outdoor irrigation to twice per week. If the Board adopts the Ordinance premises within MWSD will be allowed to irrigate outdoors only Mondays and Fridays.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt Ordinance No.____, Ordinance of the MWSD Declaring Water Shortage Emergency and Prohibiting Certain Water Usage.

ORDINANCE NO.

ORDINANCE OF THE MONTARA WATER AND SANITARY DISTRICT DECLARING WATER SHORTAGE EMERGENCY AND PROHIBITING CERTAIN WATER USAGE

THE BOARD OF THE MONTARA WATER AND SANITARY DISTRICT DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings, Declaration of Water Shortage Emergency. The Board of the Montara Water and Sanitary District hereby finds and declares:

- a. On January 17, 2014 and April 25, 2014 the Governor of the State of California issued successive proclamations of a state of emergency under the California Emergency Services Act based on continued drought conditions;
- b. On April 1, 2015, the Governor issued an Executive Order that, among other matters, directed the State Water Resources Control Board ("State Water Board") to impose restrictions on water suppliers to achieve a statewide 25 percent reduction in urban usage of potable water;
- c. In implementation of the aforesaid Executive Order the State Water Board on May 5, 2015 adopted Resolution No. 2015-0032 entitled, "To Adopt an Emergency Regulation for Statewide Urban Water Conservation," ("State Water Board Resolution");
- d. The State Water Board Resolution enacts Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 2, Article 22.5, Sections 863-866 of the California Code of Regulations ("Emergency Regulations");
- e. The Emergency Regulations will become effective upon approval by the California Office of Administrative Law;
- f. The residents of Montara Water and Sanitary District have voluntarily practiced water conservation measures for several years, including the currently officially declared drought years, that have substantially reduced per capita water consumption consistent with or exceeding limitations enacted by the Emergency Regulations;

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- g. Certain provisions of the Emergency Regulations that, if applicable to this District, could reduce per capita water consumption to the extent that the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens within the District would tend to be endangered;
- h. Nevertheless, certain provisions of the Emergency Regulations apply to this District and require enactment of this ordinance;
- i. In compliance with the Emergency Regulations this Board hereby declares a water shortage emergency in the Montara Water and Sanitary District pursuant to Water Code Sections 350 and 31026 and enacts the hereinafter water usage limitation.

Section 2. Water Usage Limitation.

Use of potable water for outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf is prohibited; provided, that premises located within the Montara Water and Sanitary District may be so irrigated on Mondays and Fridays of each week.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption, posted within ten (10) days after adoption in three (3) public places in the District and shall be entered in the minutes of the Board; provided, that the provisions of Section 2 shall not be effective unless and until the California Office of Administrative Law approves the above referenced State Water Board Emergency Regulations.
